

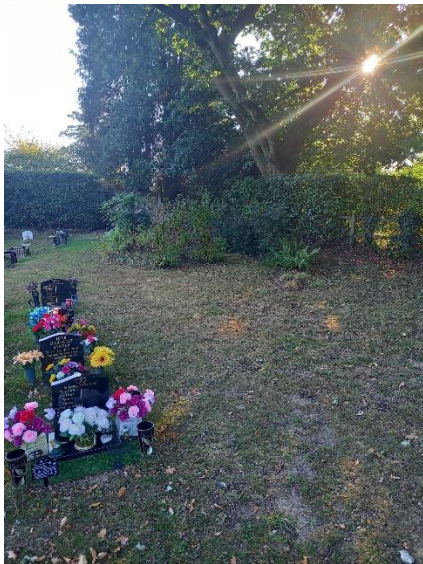

The Ropley History Network have requested permission to hold a dig on a section of land at Swelling Hill Pond.

Email from insurance company -

Insurers have responded. They have advised that in terms of carrying out the dig on the land I think the PL element would extend in terms of people being on the land. However, they advise those doing the dig should hold their own insurance for PL and EL (if applicable) for the process of carrying out the activities associated with this.

Email from Ropley History Network –

Yes we will be arranging insurance for our diggers. Insurance on the equipment we will be using will be unnecessary (mostly small hand tools). I can provide a risk assessment next week.

1. How long will the dig last?

The dig will last for no more than four days, but likely around three days on a bank holiday weekend (we are now thinking June will be a more suitable time)

2. How many people will be involved?

2 supervisors (myself and another experienced archaeologist) 2 additional diggers, 4 volunteers (who will help at the tent) so 8 in total.

3. What tools will you be using?

Small archaeological trowels, spades, shovels, buckets. No mechanical excavation aid will be used- i.e. JCBs, tractors etc.

4. Will you be putting up fencing around the area?

We were not planning on doing so during excavation as we do not plan on exceeding a depth of 1.5m, however, overnight we will be erecting some plastic net fencing around the trench.
